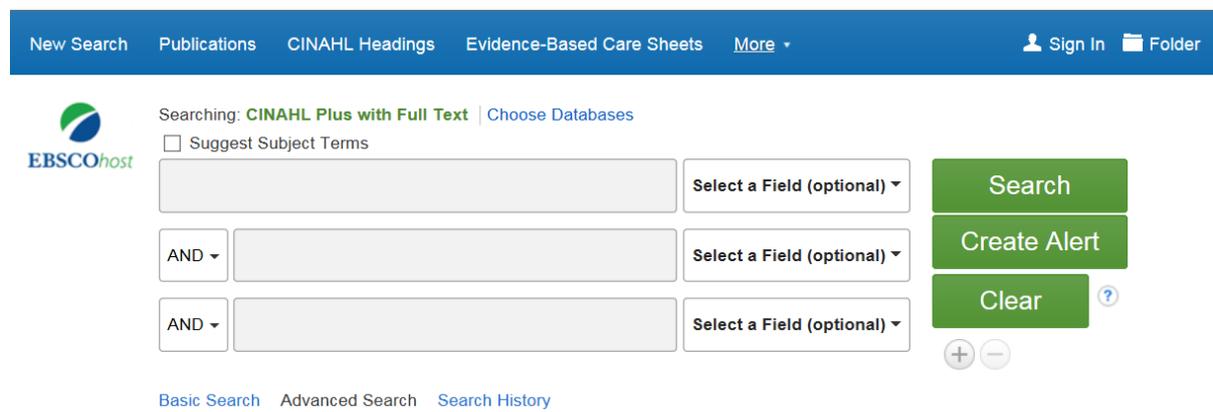

## Library Induction Sessions

If you have new or recently appointed staff in your team then please consider sending them to us for a tailored library induction. All sessions will include a presentation on how to make the most of the library service and the importance of evaluating information found online. This is beneficial for all staff who will undertake formal learning alongside their role as well as staff who will need to search for information online. We have received good feedback from the Apprentice Healthcare Support Workers who have attended inductions that lasted between 60 and 90 minutes. The longer sessions have included time for an online activity and an overview of AireShare. If you have responsibility for putting together an induction schedule for new staff, then please consider including a library session on the timetable. ## CINAHL Plus with Full Text

If you search for articles on the CINAHL database you may be pleased to learn that the NHS subscription has been upgraded to CINAHL Plus with Full Text. This gives you access to more journal articles and a few new features including evidence-based care sheets and quick lessons. You can search on CINAHL in the same way as before through the [Healthcare Databases Advanced Search](#) (HDAS) or through the [Ebsco search interface](#) (both require an Athens account). To access the evidence-based care sheets and quick lessons you will need to use the Ebsco search interface. The link to the evidence-based care sheets is on the top blue banner. To access the quick lessons, click on More. There are 139 evidence-based care sheets and 177 quick lessons. All are pdf files.

## Your reader record

If you think that any of your work or personal contact details have changed since you registered (or since you last updated your record) we would appreciate it if you complete a new registration form. This can be done online at <https://www.educationairedale.co.uk/registration-form.html>

We use your email address for notifying you if books are due to be returned, are overdue or if you have any reserved books ready for collection. It is useful if you provide an alternative email address, especially if you don't check your Airedale NHS email account every day. We also send occasional emails containing newsletters like this one. It is rare for us to write to your home address, but we may need to do this if you don't respond to emailed overdue notices.

## Book Exchange

Anyone who visits the library is welcome to borrow from the book exchange. You don't even need to have a library account! The book exchange can be found in the seating area next to the computer room. We started this with withdrawn fiction stock but around half of that has been borrowed and replaced with donated books. Even if you don't have any books that you want to donate, you can still borrow books from the book exchange and return them at your convenience. The rotating shelves are best suited to standard size paperbacks. If you have hardback books or tall paperbacks, we recommend donating these to Friends of Airedale or we can pass them on for you.

## Online learning
